Abstract:

Q. Is Galbestos a category I nonfriable asbestos-containing material (ACM) as defined under the asbestos NESHAP?

A. Most, if not all, Galbestos products would be considered to be category I nonfriable ACM as manufactured. Galbestos may still be considered such even if it were impregnated with something other than an asphaltic or bituminous binder if it exhibits the characteristics of a category I nonfriable ACM. However, through aging, chemical attacks or other processes, it may no longer be considered a category I nonfriable ACM. This determination must be made on a case-by-case basis when an inspection is done prior to demolition or renovation.

Dear Mr. Bucheleres:

This is in response to your May 13, 1996, letter requesting the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency"s (EPA) concurrence with Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's determination that Galbestos is a category I nonfriable asbestos-containing material (ACM) as defined under the asbestos National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP).

Galbestos is a generic name for a line of products

previously manufactured by H.H. Robertson Company and other related companies. Most, if not all, Galbestos products would be considered to be category I nonfriable ACM as manufactured. Even if the Galbestos were impregnated with something other than an asphaltic or bituminous binder, it may still be considered to be a category I nonfriable ACM if it exhibits the characteristics of a category I nonfriable ACM material (see enclosed letter). However, through aging, chemical attacks or other processes, the Galbestos may no longer be considered to be a category I nonfriable ACM. This determination must be made on a case-by-case basis when an inspection of the facility is done prior to the demolition or renovation activity.
