## **Abstract:**

When vinyl asbestos tile is non-friable (which is normally the case), and when the tile is removed in such a way that it remains non-friable, then the vinyl asbestos tile can be disposed at a regular landfill. Asbestos tile or asbestos tile which becomes friable during removal must be disposed at a landfill meeting NESHAP requirements.
