## Abstract:

In addition to the name of the waste generator, containers of asbestos waste transported off the facility site must be labeled with the location at which the waste was generated. Waste containers must also be labeled using OSHA warnings whether transported off-site or not.

Dear Ms. Wood:

On February 25, 1991, I wrote to you in response to your inquiry on whose name should appear on the labels that are required to be attached to asbestos waste disposal bags when asbestos is removed by a contractor. Since then it has been brought to my attention that three clarifications should be made to my response:

1. The labeling requirement is found in Section 61.150(a)(1)(v), not in section 61.150(a)(5).

 Besides the name of the waste generator who may be either the facility owner (or operator) or the contractor, section
61.150(a)(1)(v) also requires that containers or wrapped materials transported off the facility site be labeled with the location at which the waste was generated.

3. In addition, section 61.150(a)(1)(iv) requires that specified warning labels of the Occupational Safety and Health Administration be placed on all containers or wrapped materials, whether transported off the facility site or not.

I hope these clarifications are helpful to you.
