Abstract:

The asbestos NESHAP does not apply to the laundering of asbestos- contaminated clothing, although OSHA regulations apply. The disposal of asbestos-contaminated clothing, contaminated by a source or activity subject to the asbestos NESHAP would be subject to the waste disposal requirements of the rule.

Dear Mr. Homer:

This is in response to your April 26, 1991 letter requesting an interpretation of the applicability of the Asbestos National Emission Standard for Hazardous Air Pollutants (NESHAP) to the laundering of asbestos-contaminated clothing.

The Asbestos NESHAP does not apply to the laundering of asbestos-contaminated clothing. However, the disposal of asbestos- contaminated clothing which is contaminated by a source or activity subject to the Asbestos NESHAP would be subject to the waste disposal requirements of the rule. Although the laundering of contaminated clothing is not subject to the Asbestos NESHAP, this activity is subject to the Occupational Safety and Health Administration's (OSHA)-requirements in 29 CFR Section 1926.58(i). EPA recommends that asbestos contaminated clothing be treated as asbestos-containing waste material. That is, we recommend that the contaminated clothing be adequately wetted, and sealed in leaktight containers before being transported to the laundering facility. In addition, OSHA requires that asbestos- contaminated clothing be transported in sealed impermeable bags or other closed impermeable containers and be labeled in accordance with the requirements in 29 CFR Section 1926.58(k).
